Present: Tina Bromberger, Mike Cottrell, Curt Gundrum (new member, first meeting), Tim Hallquist, Peggy Kallenberger, Dick Landwehr and Duane Lawson (new member, first meeting).

Others Present: DPW Director Einweck, DPW Operations Supervisor Gerszewski and Recreation Director Yogerst.

Chairperson Hallquist introduced the two new Park and Recreation Board members, Duane Lawson and Curt Gundrum.

**7:00 PM Call to Order**

**Public comments for those items not included on this agenda** (Please be advised per Wisconsin Act 123, the Park Board will receive information from the public for a three minute time period, with time extensions per the Park Board Chairman's discretion, per person, be it further advised that there may be limited discussion on the information received, however, no action will be taken under public comments.)

**Approval of Park and Recreation Board Minutes – September 3, 2015 Meeting**

Motion (Cottrell/Bromberger) to approve the September 3, 2015 Park and Recreation Board Minutes. Carried (7-0).

**Director of Public Works Items**

**Discussion and possible consideration of an effort by Ron Reichle from Arrowhead High School, to organize a contest for all local school students to design a new war memorial to be built in Nixon Park. In addition, a volunteer is sought to participate on a committee that will select the finalists.**

Mr. Reichle spearheaded the AHS veterans' memorial a few years ago. When he saw the memorial stone from 1948 with the ten names from World War II in Nixon Park, he thought there might be a way to improve the memorial and get kids involved (any grade/any school) by creating a contest to design a memorial. A winner would be chosen with the intention of building the winning project. One of the rules is that they have to include the current stone. It will be up to the students if they want to add names, branches of service, etc. Once the design is chosen, fundraising will be the next step before building the memorial.

If we don't get a design we like, we are not obligated to do it.

Mr. Reichle is hoping to get 20 to 30 entries. He will create a committee to consider the ideas and they will narrow it down to 4 to 6. Piggly Wiggly, Sendiks

and the library have given permission to display the top choices for about a week. There will be on-line voting for the public to pick their choice. The committee will meet after the public voting is finished and decide which project they like best. Mr. Reichle will bring the chosen design to the Park Board for approval.

DPW Director Einweck mentioned that the Village would like to incorporate something that would not be subject to vandalism and would be easy to maintain for grass cutting purposes.

The timeline is to choose the top 5 to 7 submittals in late November. In December they would be displayed for the public and in January the contest winner would be selected.

Dick Landwehr, Peggy Kallenberger and Duane Lawson volunteered to join the committee for selecting the winning project.

Motion (Cottrell/Lawson) to approve the contest for all local school students to design a new war memorial to be built in Nixon Park. Carried (7-0).

Motion (Bromberger/Cottrell) to approve the selection of Dick Landwehr, Peggy Kallenberger and Duane Lawson to serve on the contest committee. Carried (7-0).

**Discussion and possible consideration of Arrowhead High School Renting Centennial Football Field for their Lacrosse Team Practices and Games**

Kevin Flegner (AHS Athletic Director) and Joe Reuteman (Mid-City Sports) met with Dave Cox and Mike Einweck regarding the possibility of using Centennial Football Field for Arrowhead Boys lacrosse. Lacrosse is a spring sport and would not conflict with Lake Country Chiefs football, which plays in the fall.

Mr. Flegner wanted to discuss with the Board any apprehension that they may have. Wear and tear on the grass is always a concern. The girls program uses the AHS field hockey field and there has been very little field wear. The boys program is looking for space. They would possibly play their home games (under ten games) at Centennial Park (JV and Varsity).

The Village would mow the field, but AHS would line it. When the season is over, AHS would repair any potential field damage. Mr. Flegner would use judgment regarding using the field during rain and wet field conditions. They would start out small and if it works out, maybe in the future Arrowhead would partner with the Village and consider turf or lights.

The Board discussed what happened in the past when lacrosse teams used the field. The Village had to re-sod the field after one season.

The first home game would be in the first two weeks of April and the last home game would be at the end of May.

Mr. Flegner has not yet spoken to the Chiefs regarding the possibility of using/renting their bleachers or scoreboard. He would certainly work with them on that.

The question was asked if the Village is comfortable allowing an outside entity to decide if the field is playable in certain weather situations.

DPW Director Einweck stated that AHS would be asked to attend the beginning of the year Field User Group meeting and follow the guidelines of the user group policy.

At this point AHS does not charge admission to lacrosse games.

The Village has a current fee schedule for the football field, which is \$100 per use for a practice or a game (tax is not charged for tax-exempt organizations). The Village efforts would be different from the football use. The DPW would be mowing, watering and fertilizing, but not lining. Mowing would be scheduled the right before a game, if possible. There will be more grounds upkeep with extra dumping of trash barrels. Staff would come up with an equitable cost that would just cover the Village's costs and they would bring a fee structure to the Board before AHS gets started.

Tim Hallquist commented that one of the user groups has wanted to mark the Village fields for years that they use and we did not allow that. Now we are letting Arrowhead High School mark their own field, but are we going to now allow the other organizations to mark their fields?

Mike Einweck answered that one of the reasons we are looking at this case is because they are another governmental body, as opposed to a private group.

Staff is comfortable with the items in the proposed agreement.

Scheduled games would be once or twice a week for three or four teams.

Motion (Cottrell/Kallenberger) to go forward with an official agreement with Arrowhead High School Lacrosse Team for use of Centennial Football Team. Carried (6-0-1). Lawson abstained.

Staff will put together a more defined agreement, along with a fee structure, and bring it back to the Board.

**Discussion and possible consideration of the annual review of the Bark River Park and Nixon Park Canteen Agreements and the Centennial Park/Chiefs Score Board Agreement**

Pete Ludtke (HAAA and Land O Lakes) was present regarding the Canteen Agreements. The only staff change proposed for Bark River is Item 10 on page 2 – the Village Finance Department has told us that our fringe benefit rate is not 35%, it is actually 50%. There hasn't been a time when the DPW has had to charge for any cost recovery.

With the Nixon Park Canteen Agreement, the change would be Item 7 – staff would propose changing the 35% to 50%.

Curt Gundrum was asked about the amount of liability insurance in the current agreements. He stated that it could be increased to \$1,000,000, which he thought was the amount on the HAAA insurance certificate. 8A (Bark River Agreement) and 12A (Nixon Agreement) General liability should be \$1,000,000, increased from \$500,000, as well as the Liquor Liability increased to \$1,000,000.

Motion (Landwehr/Cottrell) to recommend to the Village Board approval of the Bark River and Nixon Canteen Agreements with the changes discussed:

- 50% fringe benefits
- \$1,000,000 General Liability and Liquor Liability Insurance

Carried (7-0).

Dave Volk (Lake Country Chiefs Football) was present.

The Park Board has not been reviewing this agreement on an annual basis; however, it will be doing this in the future.

Staff has one modification which is on page 1, Item 5, regarding placing any advertising, names or logos on the scoreboard or press box. Except for team names and the Chief's logo, no other signs will be allowed without prior written approval from the Hartland Park and Recreation Board. "and the Village Board" should be added.

Dave Volk stated that the Chiefs own the stands, score board and the press box. There was a question about who actually owns the bleachers. Staff will research this to find the answer. The bleachers came before the press box and scoreboard, around 1991 or 1992.

Motion (Landwehr/Bromberger) to recommend approval to the Village Board the amended change to Item 5, adding and the Village Board to the last sentence of Page 1. Carried (7-0).

**Information and possible affirmation regarding batting cage fencing, reported by DPW Operations Supervisor Gerszewski**

The Department of Public Works started work on dual-use fenced batting cages/ pitcher's warm-up structures. That construction has been suspended because proper procedure was not followed. There was a breakdown in communication between Public Works and other departments, and Mike Gerszewski takes full responsibility for that. Construction will remain suspended until the design and placement can be reviewed. Staff will also meet with the user groups to determine their needs. Once that takes place, we will evaluate what has already been done and determine what will happen with those areas.

There are two batting cages – one along the first base line and one along the third base line at Nixon Park. They will probably not be finished this year.

The funds for this project are budgeted. The Village scheduled \$7,000 for fence repair for 2015. Earlier in the year staff had looked at doing some repairs and the repairs amounted to \$1,250, so there additional funds available. We thought -- what could we do with this money to make improvements? Staff on their own looked at doing the batting cages without coming to Park Board. We want to make sure Park Board has the final say once we have the design done and confirm that the Board wants this amenity in our parks.

Administration did not get approval of expenditure of funds. We will determine the actual design, the cost, seek Park Board approval, and determine if we need additional funding from the Village Board. That is the process, which could go into next spring.

Pete Ludtke talked to some of the people who have used these batting cages. He stated that he really hasn't heard a good word about them. The one on the third base line is out of the way and nobody is there. The one on the first base line is not in a good place because some Sunday games there are 75 people who like to sit there and watch the game. The cages aren't wide enough for a plus-sized player to swing a bat.

Mr. Ludtke asked about the trenches near the batting cage. Mr. Gerszewski told him that the Village laid conduit for the electrical lines in that area to the flagpole.

The question was asked if the current poles are cemented. Mike Gerszewski stated that they may have been cemented, but if they need to be moved, they will be.

The dimensions of the batting cages are 70' long, 10' wide x 10' high. They are fenced on three sides and will be netted on top and the open side.

Even though procedures weren't followed, the Board likes the idea of the batting cages. The old one isn't safe. They can also be used as a bullpen for warm-up.

The grass would be removed and granite sure-hop would be installed. There would be a border around the cages so that lawnmowers wouldn't run into the fences. It was also suggested that heavy golf mats be used for the batter's box to help with maintenance.

**SUBJECT: Batting Cage Installation**

The Village of Hartland is proposing constructing two batting cages at Nixon Park. The cages will be 16' wide, 70' long and 12' high. The cage material will be nylon mesh netting. There will be 14 poles with a cable running between the poles (see exhibit 1). The netting will be attached to the wires with plastic clips (similar to the clips used for soccer nets) and will be staked down at the bottom. We will reuse the previously installed poles. They will be lengthened two feet. The poles will be set in concrete. Crushed red granite will be placed inside the cages and will extend two feet outside the cages on all sides.

The location of the cage on the first base side will be changed at the request of the user groups (see exhibit 2). The cages will be constructed in the spring of 2016.

The existing fence work and netting is \$6,200.00. Resetting the posts and adding the two feet is \$2,750.00. The nylon netting and cables are \$1,800.00. The DPW already has the red granite.

The total cost for the project will be \$10,750, with \$6,200.00 to be paid in 2015. The remaining \$4,550.00 will be paid from the 2016 parks budget. The money will come from the capital outlay and the athletic field maintenance accounts. The wire fence material that we purchased will be used for other fence repairs as needed in the parks.

The DPW would also like to get two portable pitching mounds for inside the cages. One of the user groups indicated an interest in donating to the project. If we do not get any donations, we would budget for the mounds in a future budget.
