

**VILLAGE OF HARTLAND  
POLICE & FIRE COMMISSION  
MEETING MINUTES  
TUESDAY, March 12, 2013  
7:00 P.M.**

**BOARD ROOM, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 210 COTTONWOOD AVENUE**

- 7:07 PM Meeting called to order by Commission President Loppnow
- Commissioner Redlin read the roll for attendance
  - Present: Commissioners Loppnow, Riesinger, Redlin, Wojciechowski and Rebholz
  - Also in attendance: Robert Rosch, Chief of Police; Allen, “Augie”, Wilde, Fire Chief.
- Pledge of Allegiance led by Commissioner Loppnow.

1. Consideration of a motion to approve the Police and Fire Commission Minutes for meetings held on January 08, 2013.

Motion by Commissioners Rebholz / Riesinger to approve the Hartland Police & Fire Commission minutes for the meeting of January 08, 2013 The motion carried on the unanimous vote of the commissioners present.

2. Fire Department Update – Chief Wilde

- a. Chief Wilde reported that the new Fire Department Part-time Secretary, Julie Konen, who began work on about February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013 working 20 hours per week, is doing very well and is getting all the department “paperwork” brought up-to-date
- b. The Chief related that discussions regarding the proposed Lake Country Fire community department affiliations, are continuing, with no substantial resolutions to proposals for consolidation having been yet accomplished. The talks are “on-going”, with Chief Wilde and Village of Hartland Administrator David Cox in attendance.
- c. Chief Augie reviewed the Monthly Response Report for, each, January and February 2013, noting that, while Ambulance calls were “below average” for January, they were, as is typical, “above average” for February. Fire calls appear, per the reports, to be typical for the two months reported on.

3. Police Department Update – Chief Robert Rosch

- a. Chief Rosch reported that Deputy Chief, Mike Bagin was “back to 100%” after a three week medical leave to recover from surgery after an earlier heart ailment.
- b. The Chief related that Lieutenant Stacy Kelsey recently successfully completed and graduated from the Executive Development course held in Appleton Wisconsin in which she has been enrolled for the last year or so.
- c. According to Chief Rosch, an “area-wide”, eight week long Citizens Police Academy, with the Village of Hartland, Chenequa, Delafield and Pewaukee sending local participants concluded this evening. An estimated 22 attendees graduated. The Village of Hartland has been an active advocate for such Academies, having begun participation in the program while Mort Hetznecker was the Chief of Police.


- d. Chief Rosch explained that just ahead on the Village of Hartland community calendar is the Lake Country Community Festival, planned for Saturday, March 23, 2013 on the Arrowhead High School campus. The Hartland Police Department [as well as the Fire Department] plans an exposition at the Festival
- e. The Hartland Police Department will again participate and oversee the “pill drop” for the proper disposal of unused prescription medication set for April 19<sup>th</sup> at Arrowhead High School.. The DEA and area organizations are also involved in a similar event planned for April 26<sup>th</sup> on the WCTC campus in Pewaukee.. The Chief noted that the Hartland Police Department routinely accepts unused medications as dropped off by citizens at the police office in the Village Hall during normal business hours .
- f. Chief Rosch reported that the Hartland Police Department continues its involvement in the area-wide Critical Incident Team [CIT], now schedule to additionally include the City of New Berlin, Muskego and Mukwonago,as well. There will then be 42 individuals, in all, from the various cooperating police agencies assigned to the CIT.
- g. Chief Rosch reported that illegal use and trafficking in heroin and related opiates continues to be a growing concern in the Lake County area. Authorities have reported several recent deaths from drug abuse / overdose. A multi-agency, coordinated effort is underway to increase enforcement of laws limiting the illegal use of such substances; the Waukesha District Attorney is aggressive in prosecuting all such criminal activity.

4. Adjournment

There being no further matters to come before the Village of Hartland Police and Fire Commission and, on motion of Commissioners Rebholz / Wojciechowski, the Commission voted unanimously to adjourn for a tour of the new, recently completed Police Department Garage and facility renovation project.

Meeting adjourned at 7:42 PM.
